Motivational Mondays and Fire-Up Fridays 11am till 1pm in the Village Hall

Would you like to get a bit fitter in 2023 & tone up with us. You may think that this group is not for you. "I can't do exercise" is a common misconception. Fitness & age is no barrier. Our current members range in age from 50 up to 80+ & we do routines from YouTube videos on our wonderful village hall TV. All routines that we do can be moderated to suit individual fitness levels &can be carried out standing or seated. We include cardio fitness, strength building, toning & exercises for balance & arthritis relief.

For 2023 we would like to invite you to join us in a different way. The two-hour sessions will be divided into four half-hour parts. For the first half hour, we will do cardio routines (standing or seated) to get us motivated & warmed up. Then we will do half an hour of toning/strength routines (light, medium or heavy weights are also available), followed by chair exercises for everyone. We will then finish with some TaiChi/Qigong or mat work. There is a nominal charge of £2 & you can either stay for the whole two hours, or come for any portion that you feel would be beneficial. The choice is yours. All equipment is provided; we have exercise mats, weights, resistance bands and even steppers for when we feel really fit!

We are such a friendly bunch & motivate each other to do the very best we can, but we are not gym bunnies, just a group of ladies trying to keep as mobile as we can for as long as possible. There is never any pressure, but a few laughs along the way are guaranteed.
